Trial Format

The trial will run rain or shine. There will be two outdoor, grass rings. Classes will alternate between the two rings so that only one ring is running at a time. Both rings are fully fenced. Specials and veterans will run **after** the regular division in each of their respective classes.

Notice to Exhibitors

Pre-registration is required. Entries must be sent to P.O. Box 39, Port Perry ON L9L 1A2, and received prior to 6:00 pm on June 11, 2008. Confirmations will be e-mailed no later than June 16, 2008.

This trial is being held under the Agility Association of Canada, Inc. (AAC) Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they understand the AAC Rules and Regulations, including but not limited to the following:

1. This test is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression towards people or other dogs.
2. No leashes, collars, food or toys or other training aids/devices will be permitted on the course at any time.
3. Jump heights will be 6", 10", 16", 22" and 26".
4. There will be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date, except for injured dogs or bitches that come into season. There will be no refunds in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason.
5. Before they compete, all dogs must be registered with the Agility Association of Canada by having a valid AAC Dog Identification Card. Dogs without an AAC ID number will not receive credit for any legs earned.
6. Agility obstacles will be chosen from those described in the AAC Rule Book.
7. The trial's organizing committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
8. Move-ups from Saturday to Sunday will be permitted if requested before the close of the trial on Saturday. Other move-ups may be permitted at the discretion of the Trial Secretary.

Class Descriptions

AAC Starters Class: The starters class shall be for dogs not having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title. A dog must achieve three clear rounds under at least two different judges to be awarded the ADC title.

AAC Advanced Class: The advanced class shall be for dogs having earned the Agility Dog of Canada (ADC) title, but that have not earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada (AADC) title. A dog must achieve three clear rounds under at least two different judges to be awarded the AADC title.

AAC Masters Class: The masters class shall be for dogs having earned the Advanced Agility Dog of Canada title. To be awarded the Master Agility Dog of Canada (MADC) title, a dog must achieve three clear rounds under at least two different judges.

AAC Veterans Classes: Veterans classes are for dogs seven years of age and older, or dogs five years and older who have been competing in the Specials agility class for a minimum of one year.

AAC Specials Classes: Specials classes are open to all dogs. Except for dogs who have not yet received a final measurement, a dog may no longer compete in Regular classes once entered at an official trial in any of the Veterans or Specials agility classes. Dogs moving into Veterans or Specials from regular classes take their titles with them.

Games Classes are offered to Starters, Advanced and Masters dogs. Progression from one level to the next is as follows:

- Movement into an Advanced Game from a Starters Game requires one qualifying score in that game at the Starters level (or completion of an ADC prior to January 1, 2005).
- Movement into a Masters game from an Advanced Game requires either two qualifying scores in the game under two different judges or, if earned prior to January 1, 2005, one qualifying score in the game at the Advanced level and one qualifying score in the Advanced Standard class.

AAC Steeplechase Class: Steeplechase is open to dogs competing at all levels (Starters, Advanced, Masters).

Prizes and Awards

All dogs with a qualifying score will be awarded a qualifying ribbon. As well, in each of the Starters, Advanced, Masters, and Games rounds, first to fourth place ribbons will be awarded in each height division. In each of the Team Relay, Veterans and Specials rounds, first to fourth place ribbons will be awarded in the mini (10" and 16") and open (22" and 26") height divisions.

About Spot On

Spot On is a training facility located in Blackstock, Ontario, about 25 minutes north of the 401 at Whitby. With two full rings of regulation equipment and acres of play space, Spot On offers agility enthusiasts a state-of-the-art outdoor training and trialing experience.

In order to help make everyone's visit a pleasant one, please observe a few simple rules:

1. Dogs must be on a leash at all times except when competing in the ring or when in the designated off-leash area.
2. Please clean up after your dog. Enough said.
3. Please clean up after yourself. Dispose of waste and cigarette butts in the appropriate containers.
4. Please do your best to keep barking to a minimum. I like my neighbours and want to keep them happy.
5. **Drive very slowly** (max 10 km/h) and carefully while on the property.
6. Leave choke chains and prong collars at home.
7. Leave bitches in heat at home.
8. Be nice to all judges and ring crew. Better yet, volunteer to help! To keep the trial running smoothly, I'll require the assistance of all participants. Whether you're sharing your experience or learning a new job, your contribution will be greatly appreciated.

Recommended Roads leading to Spot On 2830 Regional Rd 19 (Shirley Road), Blackstock, Ontario



From the 401, west of Whitby/Oshawa:

Take the 401 to Pickering and exit at Brock Road (not Brock Street, which is farther east). Head north on Brock Road to Highway 7 (9.5 km). Turn right on Highway 7 and go 13 km. At this point, Highway 7 joins Highway 12 and heads north. Ignore this, and carry on along the same road (that is, go straight through the intersection onto what becomes Winchester Road). Stay on Winchester through the village of Brooklin and continue until you reach Simcoe Street, 5 km from the junction of 7 & 12. (Put more simply: stay on the same road, going straight through all intersections, for 18 km from the intersection of Brock Road and Hwy 7 until you reach Simcoe Street.) Turn left on Simcoe Street, and head north 9.5 km to Regional Road 19, also known as Shirley Road. (The turn is shortly after a large, winding hill. There is a small commuter parking lot at the corner of Simcoe and Shirley Road, as well as signs to Dreamcrest Equestrian Centre.) Turn right on Shirley Road and follow it to the first stop sign (3.5 km). Turn left at the stop sign, go 0.6 km, then follow the road's curve to the right. After the curve, go 2.4 km along Shirley Road. When you see the blue camel (honest!) at the top of the hill, you're almost there. You'll find Spot On on the right, just past Breezy Acres Farm and its four large silos.

From the 401, east of Whitby/Oshawa:

Take the exit for Waverley/Regional Road 57 (exit 431), and head north 23 km on 57 to Shirley Road/Regional Road 19. Turn left, and go 4.2 km along Shirley Road. At the top of the hill on the left is a small hall with an orange roof. The next driveway on the left leads to Spot On.

From the 407:

If you don't mind paying the toll, the 407 offers an easy route to the site. Take the 407 all the way to its easternmost point (Brock Road). At the end of the 407, the road becomes Highway 7. Carry on through the intersection, and go 13 km on Highway 7. At this point, Highway 7 joins Highway 12 and heads north. Ignore this, and carry on along the same road (that is, go straight through the intersection onto what becomes Winchester Road). Stay on Winchester through the village of Brooklin and continue until you reach Simcoe Street, 5 km from the junction of 7 & 12. (Put more simply: stay on the same road, going straight through all intersections, for 18 km from the end of the 407 until you reach Simcoe Street.) Turn left on Simcoe Street, and head north 9.5 km to Regional Road 19, also known as Shirley Road. (The turn is shortly after a large, winding hill. There is a small commuter parking lot at the corner of Simcoe and Shirley Road, as well as signs to Dreamcrest Equestrian Centre.) Turn right on Shirley Road and follow it to the first stop sign (3.5 km). Turn left at the stop sign, go 0.6 km, then follow the road's curve to the right. From the northwest/404:

Take Hwy 7/12 to Hwy 7A. Head east on 7A through Port Perry, over the south end of Lake Scugog and past Island Road and its many signs pointing to the Great Blue Heron Casino. Stay on 7A until you reach Cartwright West 1/4 Line (not on the map). (If you reach the stoplight at Regional Rd 57, you've gone too far.) Turn right on the West 1/4 Line. Go 4.1 km to the first stop sign, and turn right onto Shirley Road. Go 1 km up the hill. At the top of the hill on the left is a small hall with an orange roof. The next driveway on the left leads to Spot On.

From the northeast/Peterborough/Lindsay:

Make your way to Hwy 7A and head west past the stop light at Regional Road 57/Old Scugog Road. Continue along 7A (2.5 km past the stop light) to Cartwright West 1/4 Line (not on the map). Turn left (south) on the West 1/4 Line. Go 4.1 km to the first stop sign, and turn right onto Shirley Road. Go 1 km up the hill. At the top of the hill on the left is a small hall with an orange roof. The next driveway on the left leads to Spot On.

Please make your way up the (long!) driveway slowly and carefully, watching for dogs as you go. My neighbours are very important to me. I'd like to keep them happy!

At this point, all junior handlers will start at the starters level, regardless of previous achievements in the JH program. This recognizes the fact that the previous incarnation of the program was designed to prepare handlers for starters-level competition.

Juniors will run the same courses as everybody else (under the same judge), and will get veteran times. Junior handler Qs are available in standard classes only at all three levels. A dog running in a particular standard class with a JH cannot also run in the same class for "dog Qs" with a different handler. Qs earned by the JH toward JH titles do not also count toward the dog's title. A dog running with a junior can also be entered in other classes with another handler for Qs that will count toward the dog's titles, but in no case can a dog run the same course twice. (Whether a dog is being entered for JH Qs or dog Qs must be indicated on the entry form.)

Juniors must have their entry waivers signed by a parent or guardian. To earn Qs toward a junior title, juniors must have a junior handler ID card, available from Barbara Brown. The application form is available from the AAC web site. Juniors may run different dogs at different trials and have their Qs count toward JH titles, provided they enter as a JH each time. (That is, the Qs accumulate to the handler, not the dog.)

Dogs run by juniors for JH Qs can run at one jump height lower than the height at which they normally compete (so, for example, if a dog is over 21" tall and normally competes in specials at 22", he can run at 16" with a JH).
